

# CrossRoads 2008 FAQ:

## ***What is the CrossRoads Festival?***

First and foremost **CrossRoads** is a celebration of Faith. We're calling Catholics together for a day to pray, worship, celebrate and have a great time! There will be lots of great music by contemporary Catholic artists, speakers, food, fellowship, camping and the celebration of the Eucharist Sunday morning.

## ***Catholic music? What's that?***

Contemporary Catholic music comes in all forms from bluegrass to jazz to rock with a sound that rivals anything you will hear on the radio. Catholic artists are making music which takes into account the deeper meaning of being human, our relationship to God and to each other in Jesus Christ. It will rock your world.

## ***Who will be there?***

We've got a great line-up: Cheer Up Charlie is back along with Karl Zimmerman, Samedaykings, Joel Stein, Michael Mette, Adam Wright, the Chris Shepherd Band, pdUb and MC Paul Masek of the REAP. We'll have faithful priests to hear confession and celebrate liturgy. And a few hundred Catholics having a good time.

## ***When is the Festival?***

**CrossRoads** is the last weekend in September, Friday, Sept. 26<sup>th</sup> through Sunday, Sept. 28<sup>th</sup> 2008. The gates open at 6 PM Friday night for the "Sound Check" and the music begins around 8. Music continues throughout the day on Saturday till 11, even later in the coffeehouse. All full-admission concert goers are welcome to camp overnight and celebrate Mass with us Saturday and Sunday mornings.

## ***Where is the CrossRoads Festival?***

**CrossRoads** is being held on the beautiful grounds of the Eagle Hurst Ranch, outside of Steelville, MO. It is located on state highway 8 between Potosi and Steelville, about 90 miles from St. Louis. ## ***How much does the Festival cost?***

That's the best part! Admission is \$35 a person for the whole weekend. This Regular admission includes everything from the concert to meals, parking and camping. There are no hidden fees at **CrossRoads**. This year we are also adding new ticket options. A Family ticket is available for \$150. Admission for "Sound Check" on Friday night only is \$10.

## ***Is CrossRoads just for youth? Is it just for Catholics?***

We've made every effort to put together a concert which will have something for everybody. Teens and young adults will find plenty to enjoy in the music of our featured artists but so will families and people of all ages. By the same token, **CrossRoads** is a celebration of Catholic faith but everyone is invited. Those who share our faith in Jesus as Lord and Savior will be welcomed and find that we share a lot in common. People who just aren't too sure what they believe are welcomed as well and encouraged to come.

## ***Will there be vendors at the Festival?***

Admission includes everything you need for the weekend but there will be "stuff" available for purchase. The Ranch has a concession stand for drinks and snacks and performers will have their CDs and t-shirts available. So bring some cash cause there's sure to be a CD or two you'll want to take home.

## ***What's the deal on camping?***

The cost of camping is included in Regular or Family admission. Camping is primitive tent-style only and, segregated into "boys," "girls" and "family" sites. Primitive means no utility hook ups, no running water. Drinking water and bathrooms are available on site, of course.
